

## Confirmation of Virtual Codex Alimentarius Commission (CAC) Meeting

#### Codex Alimentarius Commission (CAC)

Members of the Codex Alimentarius Commission have endorsed the Codex Secretariat's plan to hold the 43<sup>rd</sup> Session of the Commission (CAC43) virtually and suspend the rules requiring an inperson meeting of the Codex Alimentarius Commission. The CAC43 meeting will take place in the format of four three-hour sessions from September 24-26 and again on October 12 and a fifth session with no set length on October 19, 2020 for the adoption of the report. The Codex Secretariat has circulated an invitation for CAC43 participants, which requires registration of official member country and observer organization delegations by their Codex Contact Points by September 17, 2020.

In preparation for the virtual CAC 43 session, the Codex Secretariat will host an online meeting providing guidance to Codex members and observers on September 11, 2020. The meeting will be held in Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian, and Spanish. There will also be a "side event" on the Codex Trust Fund on September 9. The goal of the Trust Fund is to enhance effective participation in Codex by developing countries.
