JMPR 2023 Call for Data: The FAO and WHO have issued a call for data for JMPR 2023, planned for September 19-28, 2023 in Geneva. The call for data is on the list of substances scheduled for new compounds, periodic reevaluation, follow up evaluation or new uses and request for data. The submission of data on those compounds for toxicological evaluation is requested before December 1, 2022. Data for residue evaluations are requested before December 20, 2022.
